Abstract: Genealogical material related to the McCubbin family line. Four file folders containing biographical sketches, newspaper clippings, land exchange notes, correspondence, obituaries and notated copies of various genealogical resources (the copyrights of which are retained by the original publishers). The primary surnames covered in this collection include McCubbin (MacCubbin, McKubbins, McCabben and other variations), Carroll, Darnall, and Griffith. Primary locations traced within the family's genealogical research include Pittsylvania Co. Virginia, Anne Arundel Co. Maryland, Green Co. Kentucky, Miller Co. Missouri and Linn Co. Oregon, with additional references to the family's roots in Ireland, Scotland and England.

Administrative Information

Provenance: Wythle F and her husband, Lloyd E Brown, donated The Wythle Brown Personal Papers to the GFO Library in the mid-1990s. The original manuscript materials arrived in 3 physical file folders, consisting of 361 pages total, arranged by the creators according to their progressive genealogical research. File folder 1 was split during scanning (Files 1a and 1b) due to size. Various oversized items, amounting to 31 individual pieces, were found interspersed among the file folders. The original locations of these items within the collections folders have been noted, via Image Reference cards, among the digitized materials.

Retention and Access: Scanned images of the collection are currently retained by the GFO Manuscript Committee in three separate digital storage locations and can be accessed via the [Manuscript Requests](#) link at the GFO Digital Manuscript website.

Processing History: Processing and description of the Wythle Brown Personal Papers began in the Winter of 2012 and scanning was completed the following Summer. Retention of the physical items of the collection has been followed in accordance with the GFO Manuscript Committee guidelines. The collection has been kept in its original order as created by its author and their file keeping methods.

Copyright Status: The status of copyright in the unpublished writings and research papers of Wythle F Brown regarding the Wythle Brown Personal Papers is governed by the Copyright Law of the United States (Title 17, U.S.C.).

Biographical Note

Wythle F Brown was born Wythle Fitzpatrick in Washington State on January 9, 1906. Her additional contributions to genealogical research include [Records of Lone Fir Cemetery, From Early Sexton's Records 1879-1898](#) (published by the GFO Library in 1981) and [Murray and Allied Families](#) (self-published in 1987), and [Genealogical Index to the Clackamas County Probate Records 1845-1910](#) with Lloyd E Brown. She died in Salem, Marion Co. Oregon on November 8, 1995.

Scope and Content Note

The Wythle Brown collection is comprised of both copied and original source materials, i.e. correspondence, family group sheets, pedigree charts, typed obituaries, noted pages from various published resources and newspaper clippings. Additional records consist of

biographical sketches, lineage notes and annotations from census and Donation Land Claim records that the author secured from her visits to the Family History Library in Salt Lake. File folder 3 also contains a receipt of payment from the National Archives and Records Administration, evidencing Brown's extended resources.

Characters of interest within the collection include Dr Charles Carroll, who reportedly migrated from Offaly Co. Ireland to America in the late 1600s, and his wife, Mary Darnall. Mrs Brown's research traces the McCubbin roots, which intersected through various marriages with the Carroll, Darnall and Griffith lines (see File 3 p 2). Various pieces of correspondence and biographical notes in the collection show evidence of the McCubbin-Carroll families' origination from Ireland, Scotland, and England back as far as the early 1600's. The research also reports the family's connections with various royals from thirteenth century Great Britain.
