The correspondence is with family members and repositories. One folder contains photos, most of which are identified. The most common surnames are Page and North. The most common location is Maine.

## Biographical Note

Thomas Neilson Page was born on 3 August 1902 in LaGrange, Penobscot County, Maine. His parents were Prince Caleb and Ida M (North) Page, who moved the family to Portland, Multnomah County, Oregon in 1911. Thomas attended Lincoln High School, the University of Oregon, and the University of Oregon Medical School, graduating in 1929. He was a U.S. Army surgeon and later an assistant state health officer in Alabama. Thomas married Germaine Dew, a native of France, in 1926. After his retirement, they returned to Oregon. Thomas died on 25 September 1995 at the age of 93.
