The collection is not limited to New York - all states are represented, and there are hundreds of Oregon items. Included are old photos, stereoscopic views, cabinet cards, letters, maps (including Sanborns), and much more. Try a search on names, places, and street names.

The site search covers all the library's collection; to limit your search to only the public domain items, click in the search box and a check box will pop up: 'Search only public domain materials.'






