She was born Jan. 31, 1874 in Bates County, Mo. and came with her parents, Asher and Mary Hamilton to Oregon that year. She had spent all of her life in the Sweet Home area, and had worked in her father's store as a clerk. She married Syrus B. Barr Sept. 21, 1891 in Sweet Home. He died in 1946.

The couple owned and operated a ranch all their married life. They celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary in 1941. She continued to live at the ranch after his death, with her daughter and husband, Mr. and Mrs. Asa Smith who operated the ranch.

Lifetime Linn Resident Dies

SWEET HOME — David William Mealey, 62, Rt. 1, Box 286, Lebanon, died at his home Saturday morning.

Dr. John W. Guepe, Linn county medical examiner, said that death was due to a heart attack.

Mr. Mealey's body was discovered by his sister, Mrs. Mary Simons and her son, Robert, when they went to visit at the home in the Liberty district.

He was born Sept. 15, 1903 in Holley, the first child of William R. and Fanny Mealey and was reared and educated in Sunnyside and Foster, graduating from the Sweet Home Union high school in 1922. He later worked as a forester, miner, builder and real estate salesman.

He was an experienced woodsman of this area, and son of a pioneer family which contributed greatly to the development of Linn county. His father was on the first Union high school board, helped organize it and wrote a great deal of poetry.

Mr. Mealey's grandfather, Capt. Charles Mealey, was one of the first marshals in the Albany area. He and his wife operated a road house on Moss Butte.

Mr. Mealey's family owned and operated a sawmill and he was a member of the Linn county fire patrol for many years.

Survivors include two brothers: George, Seaside, and Robert, Blue River; three sisters, Mrs. Mary Simons, Mrs. Rachel Rollins and Mrs. Marguerite Holcomb, all who reside near Foster.

Funeral services will be at 2 p.m. Wednesday at Bethel Lutheran Church, East Long St., Sweet Home, with Rev. John Reehl officiating. Cremation will follow at Mount Crest Abbey in Salem.

Mr. Mealey will lie in state at Tracewell Funeral Home Tuesday until 9 p.m. and Wednesday morning until noon.
