The Power of Reaching Out

Does that say "Smalley?" I slid my glasses on as I clicked the thumbnail of the August 2024 issue of the Genealogical Forum of Oregon's *Insider* newsletter, which was ready for proofreading. Granted, I am waiting for an updated pair of glasses, but that PDF thumbnail did look like it said Smalley.

Sure enough, the document opened to reveal the cover article: "Meeting my Smalley Cousins" by Bonnie LaDoe. My heart raced; there were so many pictures and names! I wanted to read through that article as fast as I could to know if the author and I were related. Would I be able to speak with the author? If we were related, how and through whom? A dozen other questions ran through my mind. I forced myself to focus and do my volunteer job: to carefully read through the entire newsletter, get any corrections noted, and send off my corrections before reading that article "for fun," as I called it in my head.

Once I let myself loose, I couldn't read the article fast enough! I re-read it, and then skimmed the article a third time for any name that sounded familiar. There were a few, but the ones in my tree had lived in other parts of the country many years ago. I then slowed down and savored Bonnie's story of attending a festival in 1991 in Gray's River, Washington, and asking if anyone knew of any Smalleys. She found a few at that event! The article tells the tale of what happened next on her journey to finding a huge family she did not know she had, and demonstrates the power of reaching out.

Even though I hadn't recognized any names from Bonnie's article in my family tree, I thought I might follow Bonnie's lead on asking about her family. I contacted the *Insider* editors to see how I might connect with Bonnie. After obtaining Bonnie's approval, the editors shared her email address with



me. I quickly crafted an email with a simple outline of my male line of Smalleys as far back as I had it, to the first Smalley to come to the New World from England: Edward Sutton Smalley, born in 1589.

Bonnie immediately responded, saying it looked like we were connected via my seventh great grandfather, Jonathan Smalley (1683–1763), Edward's great grandson, and she attached her family tree. I scoured that for additional familiar names. I found no others. I only had one son in my tree for Jonathan Smalley and his wife—my ancestor, John, born 1712 in New Jersey. Bonnie was descended from another son, Andrew. Neither of us had the other's siblings listed. Now we were each able to add one more child to our trees, and we now knew of each other!

Every time I proofread the *Insider*, I see their mission statement on page two: "To inspire and empower every person to discover and engage with their family history." I believe my new cousin, Bonnie, and I are fulfilling that mission, thanks to the *Insider* and the power of reaching out!"

# GFO Adds Another Database: NewspaperArchive

If you haven't heard the news, GFO has added a new subscription database that is available both in the library and from home for members. NewspaperArchive has more than 16,000 publications from over 3,400 cities, focusing on the small-town events of the day. The available digitized materials span from 1607 to 2024.

#### Launch Dates and Access

The NewspaperArchive service was up and running in the library on August 1, 2024, and accessible via MemberSpace shortly after. Library visitors will be able to conveniently search and explore a vast collection of historical newspapers from across the globe. Additionally, we are particularly excited to provide this service for members to access from the comfort of their homes. 

# FamilySearch Offers New Full-Text Search

FamilySearch Labs recently introduced a powerful new feature: full-text search, which revolutionizes how genealogists and family history enthusiasts explore historical documents. Unlike traditional search methods that rely on indexing specific fields, full-text search allows users to delve deeper into the actual content of documents. This canada and its content of documents.

pability enables users to find mentions of ancestors or specific events that may not have been captured in standard indexes. The tool's ability to comb through vast amounts of text and highlight relevant passages significantly reduces the time and effort needed to sift through documents manually.

FamilySearch Labs, using Optical Character Recognition (OCR) software and advances in hand-writing recognition, can convert text images into a format that can be read and searched in the full text of records. This can happen before these records are even indexed.

- 2. Mexico, Notarial Records, 1600-1909
- 3. U.S. Plantation Records cs. 1700s-1865
- 4. Victoria, Australia Probates 1853-1976
- 5. Auckland, New Zealand Wills and Probates 1834–1997

Royce answered the call to index *The Forum Insider* at the beginning of the year. Since then Royce singlehandedly indexed each issue from 2012 to August 2024. That's over




