Abstract: Genealogical research and correspondence as collected by Alice Izelle Conlon. Includes 2 folders containing family group sheets with sources. Many people have biographical sketches included. There is some correspondence focused on the Jenkins family. The research focused on early immigrant families from England who settled in Massachusetts, Connecticut and New York. The prominent surnames include Dibblee, Leach, Miner, Perry, Tracy and Weston.

Provenance: The manuscript collection of Alice Izelle Conlon was acquired by the Genealogical Forum of Oregon in one installment. The papers within files were primarily arranged by family groups. Biographical Note

Alice Izelle Dibblee was born 30 Sep 1902 in Ranier, Oregon to Harold Dibblee and Anna Belle Perry. She married Michael "Max" Conlon on 27 Oct 1929. By 1931 they were living in Portland where Mrs. Conlon was a teacher. In 1943 she enlisted in the Women's Army Corps. She is the author of *Dibblee-Perry and Allied Families* which was published in 1983. She died 22 May 1990.

Scope and Content Note

The two files that make up this collection contain family group sheets and supporting sources and notes. The focus is on the early immigrant families who settled in New England. For the most part the families are listed alphabetically. And exception is the correspondence and notes pertaining to the Jenkins and Rice families that are found at the end of File 2. The information in the files supports the information found in Mrs. Conlon's book, *Dibblee-Perry and Allied Families*.
