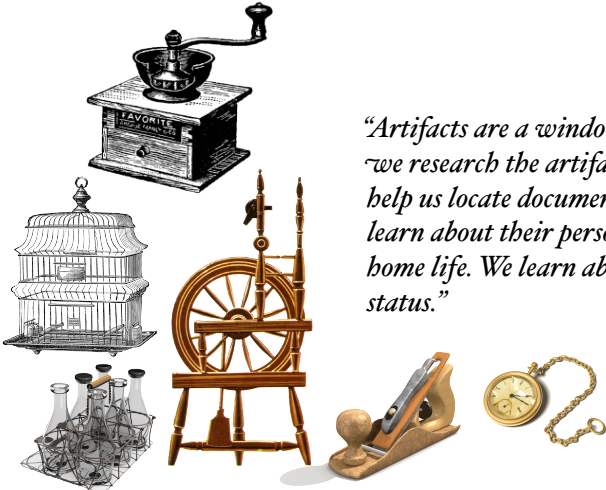

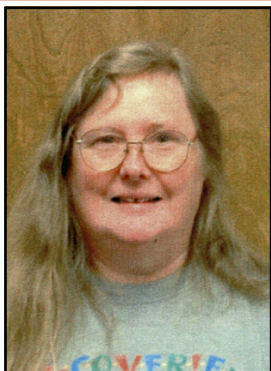

The complete Revolutionary War files are of particular interest because they may include more pages than the abbreviated files available from some other sources. Also included are naturalization documents, African American archives, Native American archives, and a wide variety of other documents. 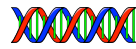
This presentation is for beginners and will cover Y-chromosome DNA, mitochondrial DNA, and autosomal DNA.

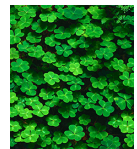

Historic Columbian Cemetery Extraction - New!

The GFO has been asked to help with extracting the records of the Historic Columbian Cemetery.

This is a major project that needs some help now. There are several card files filled with 3x5 cards that need to be scanned using the Ricoh machine in the print shop.

Once the cards are scanned, data from the scans will be entered into an Excel database using your computer at home or a computer at the GFO library. For this step there is one requirement – you **must** have Excel on the computer and be able to use it in order to help on this part of the project. This is the first phase of extracting the records. There is more to follow when this part is done.
