- FAQs – Categories of questions & answers for The Family History Guide
- Topics – Alphabetized list of topics in the site
- Learning System – A powerful yet flexible method for learning FamilySearch, Ancestry, etc.
- Sample Project – FamilySearch Project 1, showing Goals, Choices, and Steps
- Show Me Videos – Showing the screen movements for tasks on FamilySearch, Ancestry, etc.
- Choice Features – Additional ways you can control screen content
- Print Feature – How to selectively print content from the site
- Photos and Documents – Projects for FamilySearch, Ancestry, MyHeritage, and Findmypast
- Research Projects – Learn how to do research, for any platform
- Partner Research Tools – Find platform-specific research tools
- Knowledgebase – A large array of general & U.S. research tips, divided into small pieces

- Goldie May – Online manual for a Chrome extension that acts as an intelligent research assistant
- Surname eBooks – Access hundreds of free surname books online
- Partner Apps – Mobile apps for different platforms
- Activities – Family history activities for families, individuals, youth, and children
- Activities Index – Alphabetical linked list of family history activities
- Activities Planning Sheet – Downloadable sheet to take notes about activities held
- Youth Pages – Resources that help youth get involved with family history
- Blog Page – Read/listen/subscribe to weekly blog posts
