

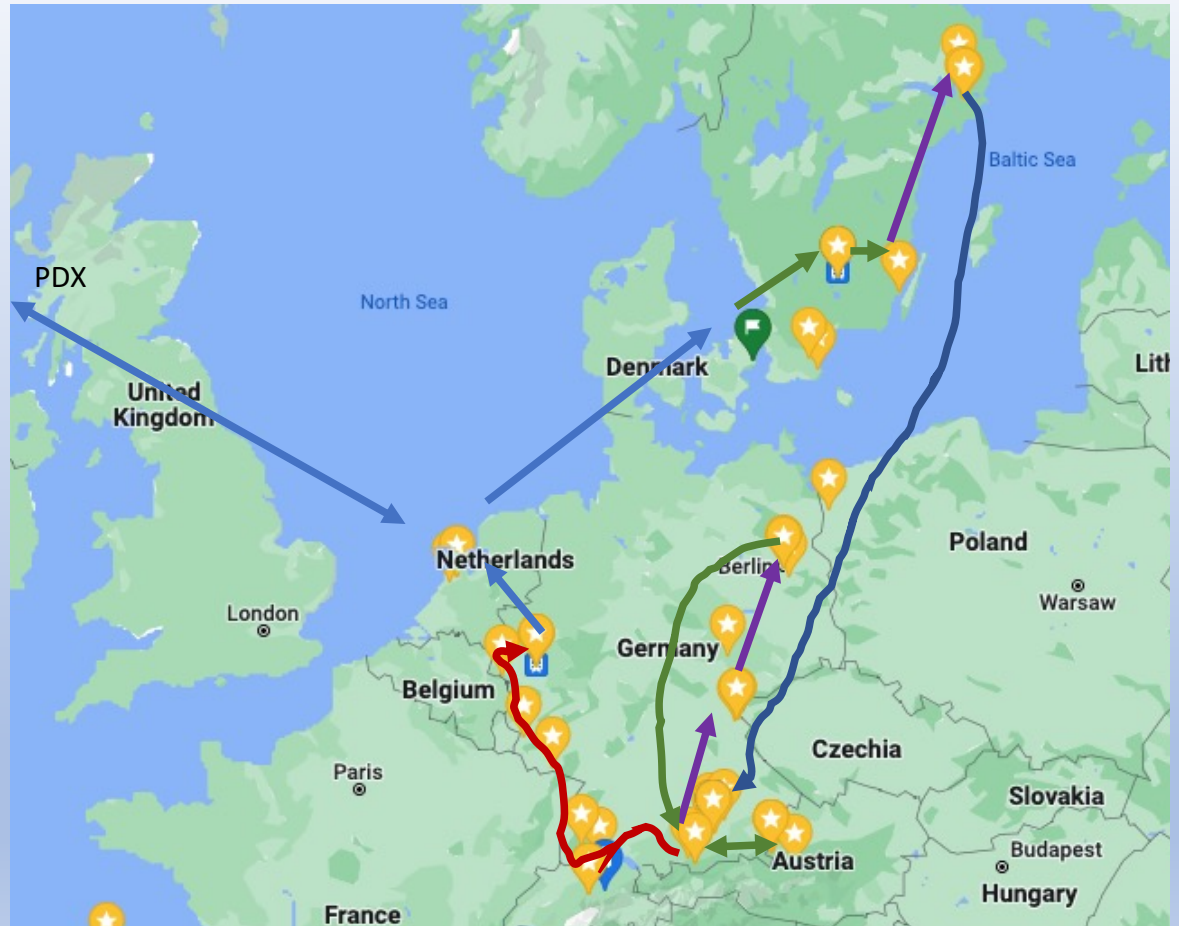

# John Kinzel Story

- Born in Arzberg, Wunsiedel, Koneigreich Bayern, 29 June 1834
- Trained as a baker
- Emigrated to US arriving in NYC 14 Jun 1853
- Met John Sheffer, confectioner in Adrian MI
- Formed a partnership with Charles F Smith in 1874
- Married Miss Barbara Stroebel of Ida, MI
- Together had 6 children
- Parents both born in Arzberg, his mother died there in 1865 and his father still lives (c. 1879)

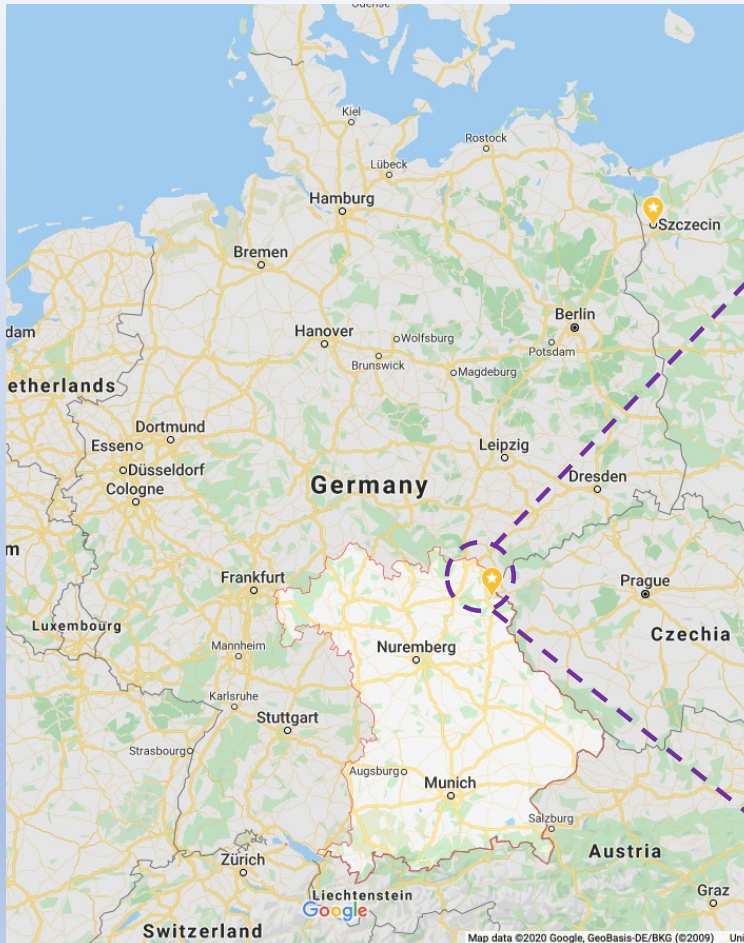


**KINZEL CONFECTIONERY.** Initially formed as Smith and Kinzel and located on East Maumee Street, in 1874 John Kinzel became the sole proprietor of this popular store when Smith retired. Kinzel's sold fruit wholesale but also ice cream and candies. Popular treats from this period would have included peanut brittle, chocolate, candy sticks, and lozenges. John died in 1896, but the sweet legacy was carried on by the next generation.

# Last Will of John Kinzel

The text highlighted:

.... I give, devise and bequeath my estate and property, real and personal as follows: That is to say, to my brothers and sisters (six in number) namely: Mararetha, Anton, Frederick, Wolfgang, Andrews and Babetha Kuenzel , or their heirs, the sum of two hundred dollars each, to be paid to them in three months after my death.

Also, to my children, to Fred Kinzel the sum of one thousand dollars, Geo. Kinzel, the sum of fifty dollars, Anna Kinzel, the sum of fifty dollars. The balance of real and personal to be divided share and share alike to Julius, Carl [Charles] and Henrich Kinzel.

**THE KINZEL WILL.**  
Considerable Interest Manifested in its Provisions.  
**AN ANTE-NUPTIAL AGREEMENT**  
**Prevents the Widow from Receiving the Usual Dower.**

Considerable public interest has been manifested as to the character of the provisions of the will of the late John Kinzel, on account of serious disagreements that had occurred between himself and some of his children.

The interest in the matter decided THE TELEGRAM to publish the will, which is short and to the point, and becomes public property to-day, by the publication of the petition for the appointment of an administrator. The will is given in full below:

WILL OF THE LATE JOHN KINZEL.  
*In the name of God, Amen:*  
I, John Kinzel, of the city of Adrian, in the county of Lenawee and state of Michigan, being of sound mind and memory, make and ordain, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament:

I give, devise and bequeath my estate and property, real and personal, as follows: That is to say, to my brothers and sisters, (six in number) namely: Mararetha, Anton, Frederick, Wolfgang, Andrews and Babetha Kuenzel, or their heirs, the sum of two hundred dollars each, to be paid to them in three months after my death. Also to my children, to Fred Kinzel the sum of one thousand dollars, Geo. Kinzel the sum of fifty dollars, Anna Kinzel the sum of fifty dollars. The balance of real and personal to be divided share and share alike to Julius, Carl and Henrich Kinzel.

In witness whereof I have herunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal the (4th) fourth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.  
JOHN KINZEL, [I. S.]

The above written instrument was subscribed by the said John Kinzel, in our presence and acknowledged by him to each of us; and he at the same time published and declared the above instrument so subscribed to be his last will and testament, and we as the testators at his request and in his presence, and in the presence of each other, have signed our names as subscribing witnesses hereto.

An ante-nuptial contract between Mr. Kinzel and his wife, formerly Anna Hochmuth, has also been filed with the will. It was entered into, signed and witnessed by W. S. Westerman, on December 2, 1892. The agreement provides that for love and affection, Anna Hochmuth agrees to marry John Kinzel, and relinquishes all dower rights, for the sum of \$1,000, and for care and support, according to Mr. Kinzel's station, in sickness or in health, during their married life.

The petition for the probate of the will requested that Frank W. Clay be appointed administrator of the estate, as no executor was named in the instrument.

# Ludwig Künzel Nagelfabrik



## Die älteste Nagelfabrik Deutschlands steht in Arzberg

Eines der vielen im Zusammenhang mit der Eisenverarbeitung betriebenen Handwerke in Arzberg war das der Nagelschmiede. Es erforderte besondere Gewandtheit. Man erzählt, daß ein Schuhsohlennagel allein schon 50 Schläge mit dem Hammer brauchte, und daß die Nagelschmiede besonders lustige, mitunter sogar schalkhafte Leute gewesen seien. Über mehrere Generationen übten Mitglieder der Familie Künzel dieses Handwerk in Arzberg aus.

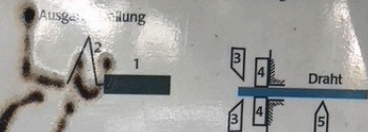
Am 19. 3. 1847 erhielt der Nagelschmiedemeister Konrad Michael Künzel die Konzession zur Herstellung von Nägeln. Sein zweiter Sohn Erhard Künzel war gelernter Eisenhändler und ließ 1905 die erste Nagelmaschine Deutschlands für vierkant-konische Nägel in Leopoldshammer in Betrieb nehmen. Gebaut wurde diese Maschine in Eigenregie durch einen extra dafür aus Frankreich engagierten Ingenieur mit Namen Millingue. Der Betrieb im vorderen G'steinigt wurde am 15. 2. 1907 von dem Porzellanfabrikanten Carl Auvera gepachtet und am 10. 11. 1907 käuflich erworben. Der Betrieb blieb bis heute in Familienbesitz.

Die ausgestellte Maschine hatte eine Fertigungskapazität von max. 50 Nägeln pro Minute. Sie war für einen Drahtdurchmesser von 3,8 bis 5,5 mm und für eine Nagellänge von 100 bis 180 mm geeignet. Für die Fertigung verwendete man besondere niederkohlenstoffhaltige Drähte. Die Maschine war von 1920 (Baujahr) bis 1975 in Betrieb. Die maximale Leistung einer modernen Nagelmaschine liegt heute bei 3500 Nägeln pro Minute.

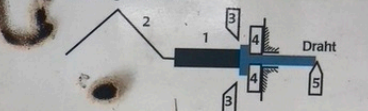

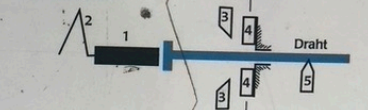

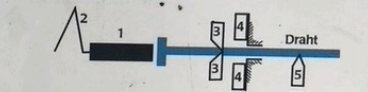

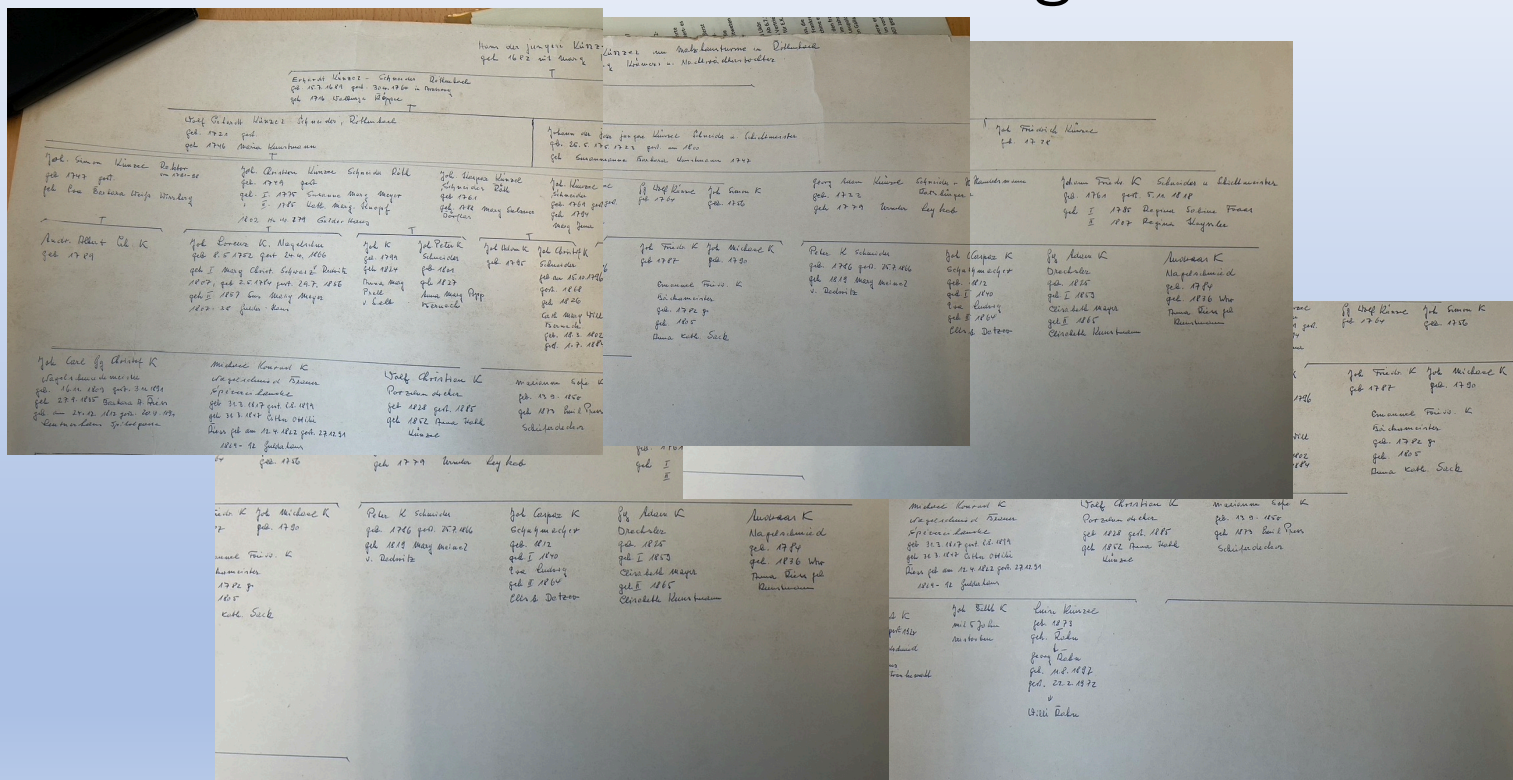
